Our work rehabilitating seals started back in the 1950's. Nowadays we rescue up to 60 Grey Seal pups found sick, injured or stranded on Cornwall's beaches every year.

Our Animal Care team provide the pups with all the specialist treatment needed for recovery. Once pups are well enough to return to the wild they are released, or for those too poorly to return we provide a new home at the Sanctuary.

See how we carry out life-saving procedures and nurture new animals in a **Behind The Scenes Tour**. From a sneak peek at our food preparation area, to getting hands on in our hospital pup pen you'll get an insight into the science behind Cornwall's only working Seal Hospital.

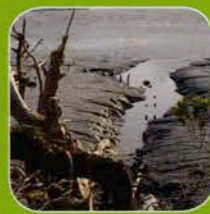

- DO** keep your distance
- DO** tell the appropriate organisation
- DON'T** attempt to put the pup in the sea
- DON'T** attempt to handle the pup
- DON'T** ignore the situation



CONSERVATION 2016

Here at the Cornish Seal Sanctuary we rescue and care for seals and other marine creatures in need of help. By sharing their stories with you we hope that you will join us in safeguarding both them and others who might need help in the future. As part of our work we actively support a number of local conservation initiatives including:



Protection of local habitats
We work with the Helford Voluntary Marine Conservation Area group to monitor and clean local estuaries. This ensures the protection of a wide variety of local marine species.



Tracking Seals
By monitoring the behaviour of seals after release back into the wild, we define best practice standards and policies that we share with the international rescue community.



Raising conservation awareness
We are working with the Cornwall Seal Group, British Divers Marine Life Rescue, Cornwall Wildlife Trust's Marine Strandings Network and Marine Conservation Society to promote awareness of threats faced by marine mammals.
